"Our fifth-graders will miss you!!!!!!"*

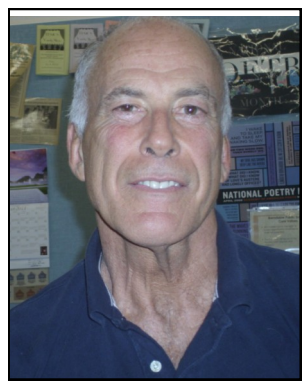


## Mr. Cartocci
